

Call for Applications: Sarah Isom Fellows

A Two-Year Fellowship with the Sarah Isom Center for Women and Gender Studies

The Sarah Isom Center invites tenure track faculty in the College of Liberal Arts to apply for a twoyear fellowship with the Sarah Isom Center for Women and Gender Studies. Isom Fellows will be asked to contribute to the Isom Center through research, teaching, and service.

- **Research** Fellows will pursue a research project regarding gender and/or sexuality that they want to develop with Isom Center staff and Isom Center affiliates; this may be a project that results in a grant proposal, a conference or symposium, or a campus survey or study. Fellows should describe their gender and/or sexuality-based research project briefly, roughly two paragraphs.
- **Teaching** Fellows will teach one class per semester for the gender studies program (for four semesters). Two classes may be cross-listed courses in their discipline, selected with the input of the Isom Center director to meet broader curricular needs; one class will be GST 399, Special Topics in Gender Studies, in which the fellow will teach a new undergraduate class that will be added to the permanent curriculum; the final class will be GST 600, Gender Studies Methodology, which is a core class for graduate students with a certificate in Gender Studies.
- **Service** Fellows will work with the Isom Center to organize the annual Isom Student Gender Conference (ISGC), promote the undergraduate and graduate minors, and help select visiting speakers.

Applicants should complete brief applications in which they describe their research project, the classes they are interested in teaching and developing, and any educational programs and projects they want to organize. The application should be no more than 1000 words. Applicants need a brief letter of support from the chairs of their departments. As part of the application process, chair approval is required. (The Isom Center will work with chairs to compensate them for the courses fellows teach for the gender studies program.)
